1. Encroaches upon the green belt area which protects both the historic city of Oxford and the surrounding rural area unnecessarily when there are other non-green areas available.
2. Once a rural green belt is destroyed it is lost for ever.
3. Encroaching upon the area around Sheperd's Pit Lane and SydlingsCopse with houses and or roads will destroy an area of natural importance. This area is the habitat of brown hares and barn owls amongst other species who are in sad decline nationwide. We have a duty of care to protect their habitat now and for the future.
4. Proposing to build houses by taking huge slabs of land lacks any sense of sympathetic or sensitive development. Barton West being a classic example of a concrete scar, lacking any aesthetic or pleasing elements. We must be able to plan and build in a far more sensitive, useful and less damaging fashion.
