**1.** There is some inconsistency between policy STRAT5, relating to density, and policy H16, relating to infill development, and a danger in both policies. Our particular concern relates to Smaller Villages.

The density requirement for Smaller Villages for small-scale major developments is 40 dwellings per hectare. Given the definition of small-scale major developments a large-scale development is inherently improbable in a smaller village.

Minor developments must demonstrate how they have achieved an efficient use of land, but there is no specific density requirement.

Infill development in a Smaller Village as per H16 suggests a density level of 25 to 30 dwellings per hectare.

Although we recognise that in some rural environments a high level of density is achievable and indeed compatible with the character of the locality, that is by no means always the case. Prescribing such high densities may prove detrimental to the character of many smaller villages rather than contributing "to protecting and enhancing our natural, built and historic environment" (NPPF 2018 §7 (c)).

South Oxfordshire is a substantially rural district and the preservation of the rural character is vital to maintaining its long-term attractiveness, as recognised in policy ENV1. We recommend that density levels for all types of development in Smaller Villages and Other Locations be made **subordinate** to a requirement that achieving such densities should not be detrimental to the character of the local environment.

2. We also suggest that Policy ENV1 ix) be amended by the addition of the words "darkness and quietness". The purpose of this is to strengthen the need to avoid light and noise pollution by more specific language.
