Chalgrove is a rural village let us keep it that way.
It's a village significantly out of Oxford, one of the furthest out sites on your prospective plans. Putting an infrastructure in to meet all the needs of so many people/properties is so unfeasible, the surrounding villages are unable to also cope with this mass site, most of the villages & not all can't have & don't have the capacity for the routes to be changed. This would also be of massive expense. Flooding & weight of traffic has always been a problem within our village and surrounding villages. Bottlenecks through Watlington, Shadhampton, Benson - Little Milton, Cuxham (all of which you have to go through one of them to get anyway) are bad enough already. The roads on all can't be expanded. Bypasses are not an option.
The runway is wanting to be moved for £21M! You could build, school, hospital facilities or old peoples home for that, & that is probably just the least amount for just moving some concrete! It's ridiculous. Martin Baker are a big employer in the area. It's safe for them to set off explosives + all their other testing. The village at present is close enough to all this as they need a perimeter around it to be safe. Chalgrove is a beautiful village lets keep it that way, we have already got 320 houses going up on planning. It is taking a minimum of 40 mins to get into centre of Oxford now with traffic so, sites nearer to Oxford would be better less time better public transport. ^{REMOVE} CHALGROVE PLEASE
