The policy of safeguarding land for a Southern Didcot Spine Road is not sound. It will give a signal to developers that the built boundary of Didcot will extend to the Spine Road. Hagbourne Field is land that must be protected. It is designated as part of the green buffer around the necklace of villages in the Didcot Garden Town plan. A Spine Road ending at Park Road is a crazy idea that will direct more traffic through the village of West Hagbourne, and lead to calls for an eastward extension of the road to East Hagbourne.
