In my view the Local Plan is not sound because it is based on some false assertions, especially that Oxford City Council has housing needs which cannot be met by use of available land within the City boundaries. It follows that SODC cannot be expected to comply with the Duty to Cooperate if the Plan is not sound.

Oxford City Council must evidence the number of new houses it proposes and justify its assertion that the City's housing need cannot be met within the City's boundaries by using brownfield and other available space. The proposal to build on this land is not compliant with the NPPF on the Green Belt. Green Belt studies in 2015 and 2019 state that it would be highly harmful to build on the Lower Elsfield and Wick Farm sites, encroaching as they do on Sydlings Copse, and increasing the risk of local and more distant flooding.

The proposal to build a link road from the A40 junction at Marston to the Bayswater Road, and potentially onwards to the A40 near Sandhills, raises the prospect of (1) wider environmental damage to the Green Belt, (2) a rat run for motor vehicles which cuts out the Headington Roundabout and associated delays, and (3) increased air pollution at a time when its damaging health impacts are becoming ever more evident.
