Dear MP

I am writing to you with regards to a planning proposal for 150 townhouses on the Bayswater Farm field adjacent to Sandhills Oxford.

I moved to the area [REDACTED] and wish to voice my strong objections to this proposal.

Sandhills is a wonderful residential area adjacent to the busy A40. It's redeeming features is the proximity of a protected bridleway and green fields, now under threat.

Sandhills has few amenities, no shops, post office, parks and this green space is crucial to the community. The current proposals for building would decimate this habitat and the proposals for road access would link the busy A40 to Barton and the north resulting in an appalling rat run for residents. HGV and at least 300 cars will access a quiet residential road adjacent to a Home and path access for the local school. Add to this a deterioration in air quality and increase in pollution with long term health impacts.

The associated destruction of wildlife and loss of trees comes at a time when the pandemic is highlighting the need to balance environmental protection for health and mental well being. This plan has been rejected before as "unsuitable for development despite the demands for housing". Please do Not let this wonderful area be lost to wholly unsuitable building schemes and turn this area into a polluted traffic island effectively.
