

There are no measures that can provide compensatory improvements to Sydlings Copse which is a SSSI because it is one of the richest habitat in England supporting over 400 plant species. Once lost these precious areas can never be replaced. Developing on fields so close to Sydlings Copse will result in an increase in footfall which will damage this fragile habitat.

The inability of the existing road infrastructure to cope with additional traffic levels is another reason why I am opposed to building on Strat 13 and Bayswater Farm Field. Local residents have considered every landing point and potential junction for the inevitable new roads and there is nowhere suitable that will not harm air quality, guarantee safe pedestrian and cycle access and threaten a much used and loved bridle path.

You will have received powerful testimony from residents about the need to maintain green fields in this area which support robust mental and physical health

I am concerned about the inclusion of Bayswater Farm Field which is not technically part of Start 13 and has not been subject to Section 18 consultation and only featured in plans from January 2019

I urge you to remove Start 13 as a Strategic Site from the SODC Local Plan and make particular reference to the removal of Bayswater Farm Field from this plan.
